Application Procedures

Under Maryville's rolling admission policy, applications are reviewed upon receipt of all required documentation and may be processed until the beginning of classes each term unless noted or program reaches capacity. However, in order to take advantage of all financial aid opportunities we recommend applying at least 60 days prior to the start of the semester.

Admission Requirements

Transfer applicants are considered for admission primarily on the basis of their academic work at all transfer institutions as reflected in their required college or university transcripts.

1. A 2.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale in college work is required for general admission. Applicants with less than a 2.0 GPA will be considered on a case-by-case basis and may be asked to participate in a personal interview before an admission decision is made.
2. An ACT or SAT is required for admission to certain programs.
3. High school transcripts are required for transfer students with fewer than 30 transferable hours or for admission to certain programs.
4. A maximum of 68 credit hours from a two-year college will be counted toward the completion of a bachelor's degree.
5. A completed associate's degree in a specific area will be counted as a minor in the completion of a bachelor's degree. If courses from the associate's degree subject area are applied to the major, those courses must be replaced by additional courses for the minor.
6. Applicants who possess an Associate in Arts General Transfer degree from an accredited institution which follows the Missouri Department of Higher Education guidelines, or a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution, will have fulfilled Maryville's General Education requirement.
7. For the completion of a bachelor's degree, at least the last 30 credit hours must be taken at Maryville.
8. One half of the major and minor (if required) must be taken at Maryville.

Academic Program Admission Requirements

The following programs have additional admissions requirements. Detailed information about each program can be obtained from the Maryville University catalog (available online at www.maryville.edu).

Actuarial Science: Applicants must have an ACT mathematics subscore of 26 or SAT-I mathematics score of 650.

Art & Design: Applicants with art and design course work must present a portfolio for evaluation containing as much work as possible from each course for which they seek credit. Slides, photographs or CD's are permissible for the representation of three-dimensional work.

Clinical Laboratory Science: Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 and a math and science GPA of 2.75 from college-level coursework.

Nursing: Applicants must have a 22 ACT composite score and a cumulative high school or college grade point average of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale. Applicants with at least 24 college credits are not required to submit the ACT. *Fall Entry Only.*

Fast Track Nursing: Applicants must have at least a 3.0 college GPA. An ACT composite score of 23 is required for students who have not completed a previous undergraduate degree. 65 credit hours must be completed prior to start of the program and must include the following courses: Anatomy and Physiology I & II, Microbiology, Intermediate Algebra or above, Statistics, Psychology or Sociology, Human Development, English Composition I & II, History or Political Science and 2 Humanities courses. *Fall Entry Only.*

Occupational Therapy: Occupational Therapy is a freshman-entry graduate program. **Eligible transfer applicants who have completed general education, science and psychology coursework may be admitted to the second year of the program if space is available.** Cumulative GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) and an ACT composite score of 21 or SAT-I combined score of 990 (scores are not required if applicant has completed 30 or more college credits). *Fall Entry Only.*

Physical Therapy: Physical Therapy is a freshman entry program. **Eligible transfer applicants will be reviewed for admission to the second or third year of the program if space is available.** Cumulative GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) and an ACT composite score of 24 with Math and Science Reasoning subscores of 20 or SAT-I combined score of 1650 (test scores are not required if applicant has completed 30 or more college credits.) Two letters of recommendation, documentation of 20 hours of observation in physical therapy settings with a physical therapist and a successful interview are required for consideration. *Fall Entry Only.*

Bascom Honors Program: Applicants with at least 60 credits to complete and a GPA of 3.5 may apply to join the program. Students majoring in any department of the University can participate in the Bascom Honors Program without adding to their overall course load.

Maryville University's Transfer Scholarships

Maryville University values transfer students and understands the anxiety, concerns and questions you may face when it comes to financing your college education. We are committed to assisting students and families in financing a Maryville education. Our merit-based programs recognize the outstanding academic and talent based achievements of our incoming transfer students. Students who apply for admission are automatically considered for scholarships (some scholarships may require additional paperwork).

Transfer Merit-Based Scholarships

Transfer scholarships are awarded to incoming transfer students by using their cumulative transfer GPA for all college-level coursework.

Applicants with a GPA \geq 3.5 qualify for a \$5,000 scholarship.

Applicants with a GPA \geq 3.0 qualify for a \$3,000 scholarship

Transfer applicants who apply for admission and meet the above stated requirements will be awarded the appropriate scholarship. GPA is cumulative and calculated based on a 4.0 scale. Renewable for up to four consecutive semesters.

Phi Theta Kappa Awards

Applicants who are members of Phi Theta Kappa International Honor Society, have at least 24 transferable credit hours and a 3.0 transfer GPA will receive a **\$1,000** PTK scholarship.

Art & Design Scholarships

Applicants who exhibit outstanding artistic talent will be considered for an Art & Design scholarship ranging from **\$500 to \$5,000/yr.** Art & Design faculty will review students who have submitted a portfolio and been fully admitted to an Art & Design program.

Financial Aid

Our goal is to assist you and your family in financing a Maryville education, so in addition to merit based scholarships, Maryville also offers need-based assistance (grants, loans and student employment). **Filing the FAFSA is required to be considered for any need-based university, federal and state financial assistance programs.** **File your FAFSA online at www.fafsa.ed.gov as soon as possible after January 1, 2009 for the 2009-2010 academic year and list Maryville University – Institution Code: 002482.** Our admission and financial aid staff are prepared to assist you in arranging your financing options such as our no-interest payment plans and alternative loan options.
