

Management Information Systems Minor (18 credits)

The Management Information Systems minor is designed to provide business and non-business majors with technology competence that will distinguish them from others in the market and on the job. Management Information Systems minors are recognized by employers as graduates who both understand the need for technological competence, and who possess the technical knowledge and skills to start day one of their careers with a competitive edge.
