## **Professional Disposition Rubric**

Students are assessed on a professional disposition rubric at three points during their degree program (beginning, middle, and end). The rubric assess 9 dispositions (Punctuality & Attendance, Ability to get along with others, Attitude towards learning, Professional Appearance, Feedback, Problem Solving, Organizational skills, Interaction with Faculty, and Self-control )on a 4-point Likert scale. A perfect score is 36.

The average score for students entering the program was: 31.1 or 86.4%

The average score for students at mid-point in their program was: 33.3 or 92.5%

The average score for students graduating from the program was: 35.25 or 97.9%

Summary of the follow-up validation survey of clinical site supervisors (spring 2020). The program surveys on a rotating cycle: graduates, employers, and clinical site supervisors.

Survey was sent to 22 clinical site supervisors and 9 individuals responded (the survey was sent out three times).

All of the individuals who responded indicated they have supervised between 1-5 students over the past five years.

All of the responders agreed or strongly agreed that students had a worldview which promoted a professional identity and reflective practice. One person indicated neither agree nor disagree that based on the student's level of experience he or she had a worldview which adhered to ethical standards and served a diverse population.

All of the responders reported they agreed or strongly agreed that students demonstrated clinical competence through the acquisition of knowledge, effective practice, demonstration of skills, and professional disposition.

The majority of responders reported they agreed or strongly agreed, based on employee level of experience, they demonstrated cultural competence through awareness of personal values and biases, understanding of worldviews of culturally different clients, developing and implementing appropriate interventions, and ongoing professional practice. One individual stated neither agree nor disagree based on the student's level of experience to understanding of worldviews of culturally different and ongoing professional practice. Two individuals stated neither agree nor disagree based on the student's level of experience to developing and implementing appropriate interventions.

All of the responders reported they agreed or strongly agreed that students demonstrated professional, social and emotional development that fostered respect for diversity and the dignity of all.

Based on program data from fall 2018 and spring 2019 program modifications were made to ensure students demonstrated cultural awareness. The following student data, from end of course evaluations, from the fall 2019 and spring 2020 semesters demonstrate a mean response of 4.73 (fall 18) and 4.66 (spring 20) on a 5 point scale (the higher the score the more in agreement with the question) for the question: The course contributed to my cultural awareness.

The Rehabilitation Counseling program is fully accredited by Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP) through the end of academic year 2020/2021. CACREP is located at 1001 North Fairfax Street, Suite 510 Alexandria, VA 22314. Students are admitted into the program during the fall, spring, and summer semesters. Program evaluation is conducted each semester using numerous procedures to assess student outcomes. The program has three tenured full-time faculty. Over the past academic year 9 students graduated from the program, 18 students were accepted, 14 students enrolled, and there were 28 students in the program. The program has a 62.5 % completion rate. Most students complete the program in 5-8 semesters and the average cost of the program is \$31,824. The university has numerous scholarships that are available to students and the program has two scholarships specifically for rehabilitation counseling students. The employment rate for graduating students at six months is 92.3%. Students find employment with state vocational rehabilitation, mental health facilities, non-for-profit community agencies, private for profit rehabilitation agencies, and the federal government. Graduates from Maryville's Rehabilitation Counseling program are eligible to sit for the Certified Rehabilitation Counselor Exam and the National Counselor Exam (the licensure exam for Missouri). All graduates successfully complete a comprehensive oral exam. Over the past year, 100% of the students who indicated taking the National Counselor Exam and the Certified Rehabilitation Counselor Exam reported they passed.
