Saints Hall is Maryville University's newest dorm hall housing around 427 residents. It's a co-ed facility and features suite-style living, which includes two rooms that are joined by a bathroom. There are 4 floors, each complete with a lounge area and a living area. Designed with modern technology in mind, each lounge area has an Apple TV. The furniture that comes in each room includes a twin XL bed, desk, chair, and a set of drawers for each roommate. This residence hall also has a gym on the main floor. There are also ping pong tables, and pool tables in the main lobby.

> Maryville University has three dorm halls: Saints Hall, Potter Hall, and Mouton Hall. There are also the Hilltop Apartments, Cove, and Ranch (only available to non-first year students)

POTTER HALL:

Potter Hall, which was once a hotel, is an immensely popular dorm hall on campus. Housing around 269 residents, each room has their own private bathroom. The furniture included in each room include extra long twinsized beds, desks and desk chairs, and a closet/wardrobe. There is no overhead lighting so it is important to bring desk and or floor lamps. Within Potter Hall, there is a beverage/snack machine, a gym on the main floor, free laundry facility, lounges/living areas on each floor, a spacious lobby with several study areas, a backyard patio, and the Res Life office. There is also a ping pong table and pool table in the lobby.

MOUTON HALL:

Conveniently located in nearly the middle of campus, Mouton Hall houses 147 students. Each floor has their own lounge and free laundry facility. There is also a ping pong table and pool table within the main level. The ground floor features snack/drink machines, a kitchen with a microwave, dishwasher and a stove. Each room contains two medicine cabinets, two dressers, two extra long twin beds and two desks/chairs. Mouton Hall contains communal bathrooms and showers on each floor on both sides of the hall. The men's restrooms are on the left side with women's on the right.

All rooms will have twin XL mattresses. Please plan accordingly, no substitutions for a regular size bed will be available!



HILLTOP APARTMENTS:

The Hilltop Apartments are only available for upperclassmen. They provide the independent living experience while still being on campus. The five apartment buildings are located on the far north side of campus, each building contains 15 Units and accommodate 50 students. Each apartment contains a fully-furnished living room, and bedroom. The kitchen appliances include garbage disposal, dishwasher, stove/oven, and a bulit-in microwave. Residents residing in a 2 person apartment will have their own designated bathroom connecting to their room. Each 4 person apartment will have 2 bathrooms to share between 4 people. Each apartment also has a backyard patio equipped with a picnic table and a grill. Free laundry service Is located on the bottom level of each building.

RANCH HOUSE:

Ranch is only available for upperclassmen. They provide the independent living experience while still being on campus. With Ranch being located just off of Conway Rd., accommodating 4 residents it serves as an additional apartment location for residents. Each location includes a fully-furnished living room, and bedroom. The kitchen appliances include a refrigerator, microwave, and garbage disposal. There are 1 bathroom that all residents share on the main floor. Free laundry services are located on the main level of the building.

COVE HOUSE:

Cove is only available for upperclassman. They provide the independent living experience while still being on campus. With Cove being located just off of Conway Rd., accommodating 12 residents it serves as an additional apartment location for residents. Each location includes a fully-furnished living room, and bedroom. The kitchen appliances include a refrigerator, microwave, and garbage disposal. There are 4 bathrooms with 2 on each floor with 1 to the left and 1 to the right. Free laundry services are located on the main level of each building.

ROOM DECOR:

- Desk Lamp(s) and/or floor lamp(s)
- Posters/wall decorations
- Dry-erase/memo board
- Small trashcan
- Tension rods for curtains (not applicable for Saints Hall or Potter Hall)
- Command Hooks

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS:

These items are NOT allowed:

- Candles/incense
- Pets- you can ONLY have fish in an aquarium (10 gal. max)
- Water filled furniture
- Fireworks/Fuel
- Open heat sources appliances (toasters, toaster ovens, air fryer, etc.)
- Halogen lamps
- Firearms, hunting equipment (bows, taser, pepper spray, knives, etc.)
- LED strip lights
- Wallpaper
- Wall nails and/or screws
- Coffee Maker (Pot)
