

CRRSA Act Fund Distribution Methodology February 20, 2021

As we determined how to distribute the CRRSA Act funds to students, Maryville sought to adhere to the U.S. Department of Education guidance to limit subjectivity, promote ease of management and reporting, prioritize need, and make funds widely available to eligible students.

Funding was prioritized for students with need, and allocated broadly among all eligible students that met the need criteria. Funds were automatically disbursed to eligible students.

Students with a Zero – 5,711 EFC Based on 2020-2021 FAFSA- \$ 350.00

Determination for highest need was aligned with EFC requirements for Pell Grant eligibility. Funding was automatically awarded to all Title IV eligible students that were enrolled in the Spring 2021 term as of 02/22/2021 with and EFC less than 5,712.

Students with a 5,712 – 12,000 EFC Based on 2020-2021 FAFSA- \$ 225.00

Determination for high need, outside of the Pell eligibility range, with within EFC requirements for Missouri State Need Based Aid eligibility. Funding was automatically awarded to all Title IV eligible students that were enrolled in the Spring 2021 term as of 02/22/2021 with and EFC between 5,712 and 12,000.

Process

Eligible students received an email providing them with information on the automatic distribution disbursed to them. No grant was applied to Student Account Balances. Students were given the opportunity to update their refund preferences, to expedite the process.

Eligible students without an eRefund profile with direct deposit created were issued a paper check that was sent to the student address on file.
